Federal Government Transition Updates/Impacts

- Recognize lots of uncertainty and dynamic landscape causing stress
- If no XO/Memo, then no change (but see point 1)

What we know:

- Funding should not be paused; FY25 Cooperative Agreement proposal window open
- University policies have not changed (you are University CI employees); requested guidance from UW Attorney General's office – data, IP, censorship
- Changes at NOAA may impact your work, OK to ask questions, reach out
- Need for work has not disappeared

Latest Uncertainties:

- DOGE visit to NOAA headquarters: misreported in press (but no further details yet)
- Changes at NOAA may impact your work, may differ among line offices OAR, NMFS (e.g. last night some data sites not available, maintenance (?))

Federal Government Transition Updates/Impacts

Latest Uncertainties:

- International Engagements (travel, virtual meetings, NOT email): OAR – 'review and clear all upcoming international engagements', Apply to CI employees? Yes, if using NOAA affiliation (could change); NMFS – email exchanges if using NOAA account

General Approach

- University policies have not changed (you are University CI employees); requesting guidance from UW Attorney General's office; use UW email account
- I am at a College of the Environment meeting every morning to review changes and reactions as they become available
